

What's That Odor?

We are working in your neighborhood to repair underground sewer pipes without digging them up or causing major disruption to your property using the Cured-In-Place Pipe (CIPP) process.

The process involves recycling the existing sewer pipe by installing a resin-saturated felt tube into the host pipe. Once in place, the tube is inflated to fit tightly inside the original pipe and cured to create a new plastic pipe within the old pipe.

During the process, you may experience the following:

- A steam cloud may be visible in the air and will dissipate quickly when the process is complete.
- There may be a “glue like” odor during the curing process that arises from a component used in CIPP. Once the CIPP is fully hardened, the odor will be eliminated.
